Central Washington

Public Comment

- Maintain and improve quality of life in residential areas.
- Avoid displacement of long-time residents and create more affordable housing.
- Leverage existing open spaces to create recreational opportunities for a wide range of users based on age, ability and interests.
- Create more parks and recreational opportunities to keep up with growing population in new central neighborhoods.
- Improve non-vehicular transportation to and from Central Washington.

Agency Input

- Rebuild Maryland Avenue SW, as recommended in the *2012 Maryland Avenue SW Small Area Plan*.
- Revitalize L'Enfant Plaza through green and sustainable upgrades, as recommended by the National Capital Planning Commission in the *2012 Southwest Ecodistrict Initiative*.
- Integrate recommendations from the *2019 Downtown East Plan* and the *2014 Mid City East Small Area Plan*.
- Integrate in the text the Burnham Place project north of Union Station.
- Update language about the vision for Pennsylvania Avenue NW to reflect current work of local and federal agencies.
- Support new transit connection from Union Station to Georgetown.
- Update language to reflect development and land use changes in Mount Vernon Square, NoMa, and the Old Convention Center Site.
